This Award is given in recognition Women's Plans Foundation and is presented annually by The National Council of Women at its Australia Day Luncheon at Parliament House.

Applications are sought from students with a demonstrated interest in global health. Preference will be given to students of reproductive health who have an understanding of the role of family planning in women's development in third world countries.

The Awardee will be expected to be present to receive the Award at the Australia Day Luncheon at Parliament House in 2010, and to speak later in the year at a Women's Plans Foundation function about what the Award is achieving.

Women's Plans Foundation is a charitable trust advocating the integration of a family planning component in overseas aid programs. The Foundation raises funds and gives grants overseas aid organizations to enable people to choose the number and spacing of their children, improving community health, education for all and environmental sustainability.

1. Applicants must be currently enrolled students.
2. Applications should include a 200 to 300 word account of the student's academic record, and an account of demonstrated interest in reproductive health and family planning as a component of women's development in third world countries. Applicants may include an account of volunteer work or special need. The application should be submitted electronically, as a Word doc or pdf. Submissions should be emailed to oppenama@bigpond.com.
3. Applications should be accompanied by a reference from a faculty member who has taught the applicant.
4. All entries need to be submitted by **November 1, 2011**. Applications that are not submitted by this deadline will not be eligible for the Award and there will be no extension of the deadline.
5. The Awardee will be selected by a panel of members comprising a staff member of the Faculty of Nursing & Midwifery, University of Sydney, and appointees of Women's Plans Foundation. The panel's decision will be final.
